
Survey Results



Generally speaking, do you think the country is headed in the right direction or the wrong direction? Sample Size: 1,250




Do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling his job as President? Sample Size: 1,250










How would you describe the current state of the American economy? Sample Size: 1,250

In the presidential primary election in your state next year, are you more likely to vote in the Democratic or Republican primary election for president, or are you unlikely to participate in either?








How likely are you to vote in the November 2024 elections for Governor, U.S Senate, and other offices? Sample Size: 1,250









Which of the following best represents your current trust level regarding the American electorate process? Sample Size: 1,250






Do you believe the Biden family, including Joe Biden himself has illegally benefited from taking millions of dollars in exchange for favorable policy decisions from foreign countries?




Which of the following is your age range?


What generation are you part of?


What is the highest level of education you have completed?
















Which of the following categories best describes your employment status?






What is your present religion, if any?
