
# Spry Research - Nationwide Survey, May 2023

This survey was conducted by online panel interviews from May 2-4 among a sample of 1250 registered voters. Results are weighted to reflect known demographics.


#### Q1 : Registered Voter



Do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling his job as President? Sample Size: 1,250












How would you describe the current state of the American economy? Sample Size: 1,250

How likely are you to vote in the November 2024 elections for Governor, U.S Senate, and other offices? Sample Size: 1,250



#### Q9: Biden v Trump


Hypothetically, if the 2024 Presidential Election were held today and the candidates were Joe Biden and Donald Trump, which candidate would you support?



To what extent do you agree or disagree with this statement: China has more leverage over the United States than the United States has over China. Sample Size: 1,250
























